MRPP Honors Judy Ringel With Bob James Award

Memphis Regional Planned Parenthood presented Judy Ringel with the second annual Bob James Award during a Sept. 28 reception at Elfo's. The Bob James Award honors an individual's unwavering support of the ideals of MRPP.

The event raised \$19,000 to benefit MRPP's community efforts. Prominent Memphians U.S. Congressman-elect Steve Cohen and state Rep. Beverly Marrero joined the festivities.

Ringel, formerly the senior editor of *Memphis* magazine, served on MRPP's board of directors for six years, including two as chair.

"I feel very strongly that top-quality family planning and reproductive health care services should be available to every woman in Memphis," Ringel said, "not just to those who can afford to pay full price for them.

"I'm also a strong advocate of the kind of sexuality education that Planned Parenthood provides. Today, young lives may literally depend on being properly informed—not only to prevent unintended pregnancies, but also to protect against AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases."

Ringel's first book, *Children of Israel*, was published in 2004. She has received numerous awards, including the Journalism Award of Excellence from the American College of Emergency Physicians and, together with the editorial staff of *Memphis* magazine, the Sigma Delta Chi Distinguished Service Award from the Society of Professional Journalists. She will be listed in the 2007 edition of *Who's Who in America*.

Throughout his life, Memphis City Councilman and business leader Bob James championed Planned Parenthood's mission. Upon his death in 2004, James bequeathed \$1,000,000 to create an endowment fund at the Community Foundation to support MRPP. His generosity allows MRPP to continue serving the MidSouth regardless of clients' ability to pay. The Bob James Award salutes its namesake and those who follow in his footsteps.

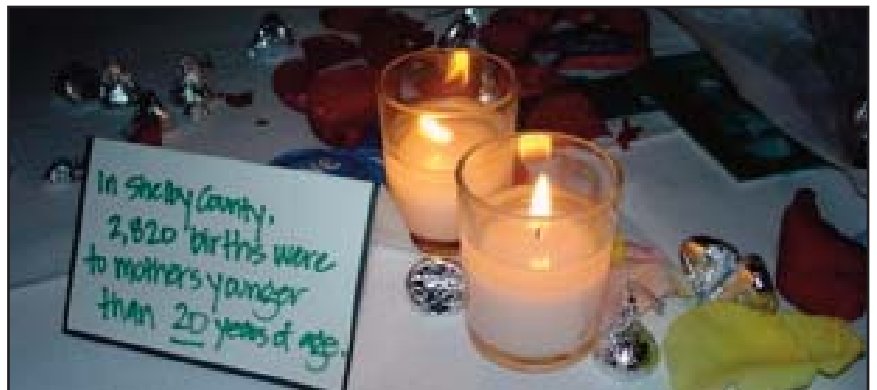
Memphis Brings Sexy Back!

World AIDS Day Event to Include Memphis Rap Group Da Volunteers

Memphis Regional Planned Parenthood will be offering free HIV testing and information Dec. 1 at the Orange Mound Community Center, 10 a.m.-4 p.m., in recognition of World AIDS Day. Local rap group Da Volunteers will greet attendees and sign autographs. WMC-TV, Action News 5, will broadcast live from the event.

The goal of the World AIDS Campaign is "to energize and support an effective and sustained response to the HIV pandemic. By helping partners work together at national and international levels, we will broaden the partnership among those shaping the response to AIDS. Crucial to our success will be increased public awareness of past policy commitments and promises on AIDS, including the Declaration of Commitment on HIV/AIDS."

The theme for World AIDS Day 2006 is accountability.

SD Abortion Ban Defeated

South Dakota voters rejected a law that would have banned abortions even in the case of rape or incest.

The S.D. Legislature approved the ban in February, hoping that opponents would sue and the case would be brought before the U.S. Supreme Court.

Opponents instead gathered enough petition signatures to hold a popular vote.

The abortion ban was defeated Nov. 7, 56% to 44%.

MRPP Volunteer Recognized by PPFA *Swatzell travels to Minnesota, Wisconsin*



Christy Swatzell represented MRPP at Planned Parenthood's Electoral Boot Camp and Central Region Conference.

MRPP volunteer and student activist Christy Swatzell was rewarded for her nomination as Central Region Young Volunteer of the Year. Planned Parenthood Federation of America provided her with an all-expenses-paid trip to Minnesota for the Central Region 2006 Conference, "Constructing a New Reality."

Swatzell also traveled to Wisconsin in early November as a Young Emerging Leader in PPFA's Electoral Boot Camp. She joined affiliate and national staff as they canvassed door-to-door and encouraged voters to support candidates who are friendly to reproductive rights.

Their efforts paid off. Incumbant Governor Democrat Jim Doyle defeated Republican Mark Green, who opposes emergency contraception and abortion, even in cases of rape or incest.
