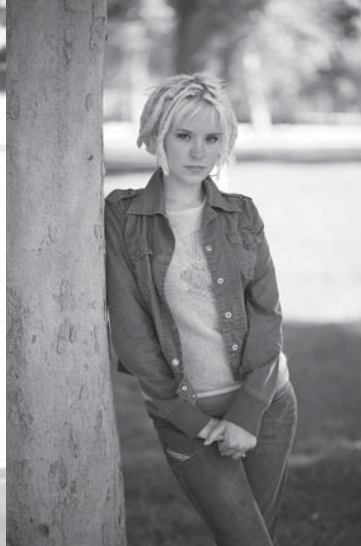

As we look back over the year that was we're amazed by the accomplishments we achieved together, especially against the drastic changes in the economic environment. First, we thank our donors, supporters, volunteers, and friends for our collective defeat of Proposition 4, the latest parental notification initiative. Working locally and across the state we've been able to keep our teens safe by defeating this dangerous initiative three times in the last three years. The challenge that lies ahead is keeping it off the ballot to begin with. We already know it will be back, but we also know that you will be too.

This year we'll see an unprecedented 19,500 patient visits and every day we hear from patients about how much they appreciate being able to come to Planned Parenthood for the exceptional quality care they receive.

This past fall we offered a series of three classes to help women and their partners explore and understand the changes at mid life. We had fabulous presenters who spoke to a sold out house!

Our medical outreach program continues to evolve and expand to Hoopa and other underserved areas of the county. The staff goes all out to make sure these clients receive service when transportation and communication are challenging.

Our Spare Change educators continue to inspire us to look at some of the important issues that face our community like domestic violence, abuse, body image and changing sexuality, all with humor and focus. Likewise, Clergy for Choice provides their wise and compassionate counseling services not only to clients but to those of us in leadership positions within the organization.

As we look forward with renewed hope for the leadership in our country we are also faced with unprecedented economic challenges. Whatever those challenges present, we gain strength from your support.

Patient Services

- Contraceptive services drew the largest clientele. The most popular methods are:
 - 1) oral contraceptives
 - 2) male condoms
 - 3) Nuvaring, a low hormonal dose vaginal ring.The interuterine device (IUD) has also been increasing in popularity.
- We performed 71 vasectomies and had three volunteer educators participating in our vasectomy informed consent education program.
- Patient visits increased 10% to 18,529.
- We dispensed over 5,100 boxes of emergency contraception (EC).
- Our Outreach Program had 1,335 patient visits. This program is federally funded by Title X for off site STD screening and non-exam family planning for youth under age 25.
- Women over 40 continued to enjoy extended appointment times and mid-life services, access to free or low cost medications and mammograms.

Patient Services

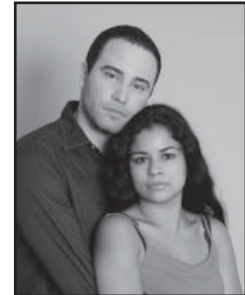
- First trimester abortion services comprised about 7% of our medical services. About 30% of our abortion patients chose medication abortion. The average age of women seeking abortion at SRPP was 25.
- Our clinic was fully staffed with five full time providers and two per diem providers allowing us to fully utilize our new building.
- We saw a total of 7,910 patients this year.

From the Clinic

Gregory, a man in his early twenties, recently learned that his partner was HIV positive. He was feeling very stressed and immediately came to our Eureka clinic for STD testing. Luckily, Gregory was able to get an HIV test that very same day. The staff at SRPP was able to offer counseling, talk about risks, and provide education about HIV.



Education

- 2007-08 marked the 30th anniversary of our first education programs in the schools.
- In 2007-08 our medically accurate sex education programs reached youth in 28 schools in Humboldt County and 10 schools in Trinity County.
- We presented three workshops to help parents communicate with their children about sexual issues and family values. One was held in Fortuna and provided in Spanish.
- We loaned Baby Think It Over computerized infant simulators to 8 Humboldt schools. These life-like “babies” help youth understand the responsibilities of parenting. We are newly coordinating this project.
- Staff, volunteers and teens shared information about reproductive health, family communication, healthy relationships and other topics at 10 health fairs and events including the first Latino NET Health Fair and the Homeless Connect Day.
- Our Del Norte Teen Outreach peer education group helped Open Door Community Health with a survey to assess teen clinic services.

Education

- SRPP's International Advocate presented a three session course on population through the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute. We also sponsored a visit by a physician from Afghanistan, who gave a talk to a rapt audience about health care in his country.
- Spare Change peer educators reached 2,900 youth and community members in theater performances at 14 sites and classroom presentations at 10 middle schools. The 15 member group writes new skits about teen health and relationships each year. Their May graduation celebration got full page coverage, with photos, in a Eureka newspaper.

Spare Change Peer Educators Speak Out

Times-Standard Interviewer: Why do you feel Spare Change is a good program, and why should it continue?

Cecily Olson, age 17, member of Spare Change: I truly believe that Spare Change helps people. I have learned so much from it, and I know that others do too because they tell me they do. We save people's lives. In my opinion, that's the only reason anyone should need as to why Spare Change should continue.

Public Affairs

- Almost 180 supporters attended the 2008 Choices Breakfast to hear national public policy strategist Elizabeth Arndorfer describe how finding a common ground in the way we talk about abortion has been shown to increase the number of pro-choice supporters.
- Don Avant, long-time SRPP volunteer, was presented with the annual Maggie Award at the Choices Breakfast in recognition of his many years of work on behalf of reproductive health services. Among the many volunteer activities Don participated in during 2007-08 was attending statewide Legislative Committee meetings in Sacramento to review and determine strategy around proposed California legislative bills.
- SRPP participated in the “Red Counties Project” organized by Planned Parenthood Affiliates of California. The Project is conducting research in counties that traditionally vote anti-choice to look for points of agreement with voters to change their votes. Previous research has shown that even anti-choice voters overwhelmingly have a favorable impression of Planned Parenthood and the important role it plays in improving community health, and that building on this favorable impression can encourage voters in “red” counties to vote pro-choice.

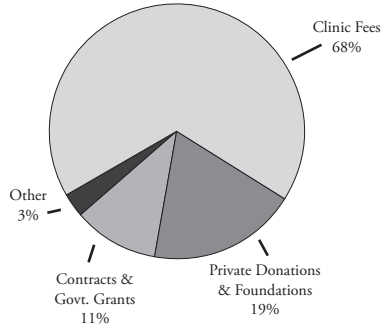

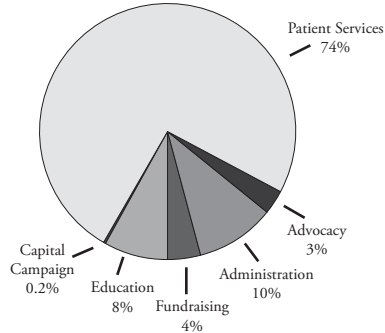
- In March volunteers held an Irish Tea and Celebrity Cake Auction at Fieldbrook Winery to raise funds for public affairs activities. The weather cooperated, the cakes were fabulous, and over \$5,000 was raised!
- In April six SRPP staff and volunteers traveled to Sacramento to join 600 other Planned Parenthood supporters from around the state to rally in front of the Capitol and meet with our legislators to urge their support for family planning funding.
- HSU VOX Students for Choice participated in numerous activities including tabling on campus and community events and took a leadership role in coordinating the Vagina Monologues in February.
- International Advocate Frederica Aalto gave a series of presentations on the current status of population and family planning programs worldwide.
- The proponents of the last two parental notification initiatives defeated by California voters introduced the initiative again for the third time. Planned Parenthood and its Coalition members immediately started planning strategy to defeat the initiative—again.

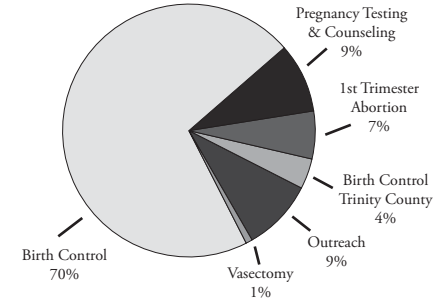
Source of Funds
