

Meeting People Where They Are

As Planned Parenthood Association of Utah (PPAU) completes 40 years of service in our pretty, great state, we reflect on the highs and lows of the last fiscal year.

Starting with a big high, late this summer the Department of Health and Human Services announced that under the Affordable Care Act many women's preventive services - most notably birth control - would be at no cost to women. This comes after extensive scientific review by the Institute of Medicine who determined the health benefits of family planning is a core primary preventive health care service. The recommendation validates the work and mission that we are committed to at PPAU.

In a year riddled with low points, the most offensive had to have occurred in early April. A politically motivated agenda from U.S. House of Representatives that began when they assumed power in 2011 came to a head by nearly shutting down the federal government simply because some Planned Parenthoods across the nation receive federal dollars to provide reproductive health care. Because of this threat, we met with Utah's delegation and also participated in an inspirational rally on the Mall with a sea of pink shirts "Standing With Planned Parenthood". The leadership blinked when the President said, "NO" and stood with Planned Parenthood. But the issues haven't died. They have now moved to the states and still continue in Washington.

Regardless of politics, in this annual report we are proud to highlight PPAU's new strategic plan for continuing our work for the next three years. *The priorities are:*

- Priority 1...* Leveraging technology to improve access to sexual health information and care
- Priority 2...* Continuing to build our political expertise to include grassroots advocacy and ensure access to our services
- Priority 3...* Recruiting and developing young, diverse leaders
- Priority 4...* Continuing to engage diverse communities to reduce health disparities and improve sexual health for our next generation

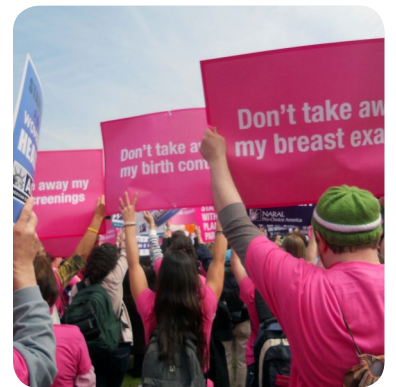

Priority 1... a world transformed by technology

Meaningful use is using certified electronic health record (EHR) technology to:

- Improve quality, safety, efficiency, and reduce health disparities
- Engage patients and family
- Improve care coordination and public health
- Maintain privacy and security of patient health information

Ultimately, it is hoped that the meaningful use compliance will result in:

- Better clinical outcomes
- Improved health outcomes
- Increased transparency and efficiency
- Empowered individuals
- More robust research data on health systems

With this in mind we will implement...NextMD.

NextMD: Forward-Thinking Electronic Health Records (EHR)

The NextMD software will complement our EHR system, and increase the efficiency for clinical staff to focus on providing clients with personalized medical care.

NextMD will not replace valuable face-to-face client interaction, but will supplement PPAU's high-quality health care services. It will provide a high-tech medium for clients to request prescription refills, schedule appointments, confirm or cancel an office visit and timely delivery of lab test results. Clients will also be able to review their medical record. The NextMD software will be an effective tool to communicate with clients and ensure follow-up care is addressed after lab results are obtained. PPAU is dedicated to streamlining services to reduce overall costs and the use of technological tools to improve the delivery of information.

PPAC protects and promotes sexual and reproductive health and rights by educating voters, public officials, and candidates. Heather is a leader in the criminal justice community, involved in victim advocacy and public awareness surrounding the prevalence and prevention of sexual assault. She is also a past board member of PPAU. Heather completed a Master's degree in Public Administration at the University of Utah.

Ready...Set...Engage: It's all about teens in 2011-2012

PPAU launched four new superb programs that engage youth to create lasting change.
Each of the programs are evidence based, time tested, and impactful.

WYMAN'S TEEN OUTREACH PROGRAM® (TOP): The PPAU "Teens are TOPS!" clubs are happening in Midvale, West Valley, Rose Park and Glendale. PPAU staff are trained to provide the Wyman TOP® curriculum, a 25 week youth development program that features community service learning, activities and fun group interaction. TOP® teens are 51% less likely to be involved in a pregnancy than their peers and 54% less likely to fail a course in school. Here's what teens in Midvale are saying about their TOP Club:

TEEN SUCCESS: A program with a 20-year history of success in reducing second pregnancies among teen parents. PPAU partnered with the YWCA of Salt Lake City to launch the program in February 2011. The group meets weekly, supports 12 pregnant and parenting girls age 14 – 18 with life skills, support in reaching personal and educational goals and maintaining family size through the teen years. Guest speakers have included staff from the Legal Aid Society who discussed affordable legal services, a University of Utah Professor who addressed access to higher education, and YWCA educators who addressed boundaries and healthy relationships.

TEEN COUNCIL: PPAU is proud to roll out Teen Council, a peer education program developed over 20 years ago by Planned Parenthood of the Great Northwest. Teen Council empowers 10th-12th graders with in-depth education and training so they can effectively reach their peers with accurate information and education. These young women will be role models in our community, teach classes to middle schools, and shape the future of health education and advocacy.

LEAD AMBASSADORS (LIVING INTO EQUALITY, ACCEPTANCE AND DIVERSITY):

A group for LBGTQ youth and their allies offered by PPAU with the Grace Episcopal Church in St. George. The group includes presidents of several local Gay Straight Alliances. LEAD Ambassadors develop youth leadership skills, affirm individual identities and increase skills that promote healthy behavior. Here is what teen members are excited about and why they keep coming back to group.

"Information and training...Everything! Encompassing queer history, local LBGT issues. Issues within the education system....Safe sex, feeling safer in our respective sexualities, learning about safer sex, terminology, healthy relationships, coming out, and safe texting/technology."

PPAU EDUCATORS USE A POSITIVE AND PROACTIVE APPROACH to create safe places for honest and accurate conversations about sexuality. Education programs build skills and support individual decision-making about sexual health, health of their peers, and loved ones. Class topics are diverse, including healthy relationships, reproductive anatomy, contraception, STI's, puberty education and parent-child communication.

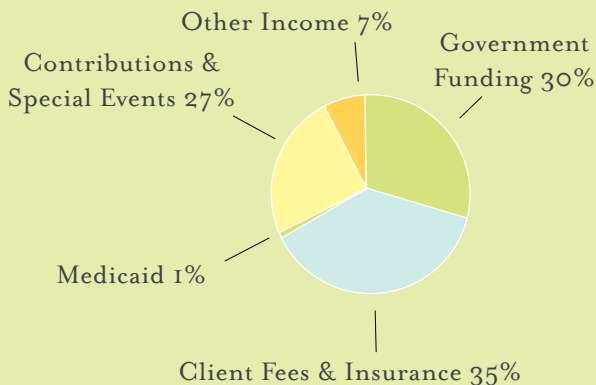

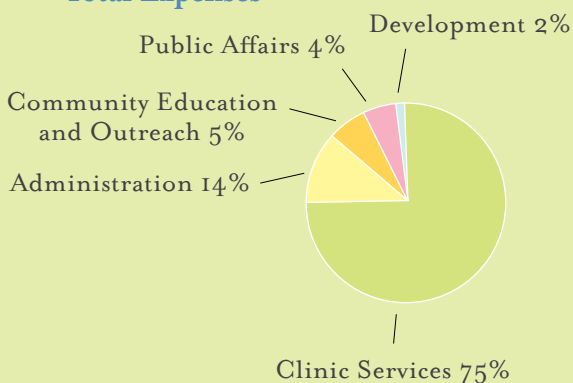
