OUR MISSION

Planned Parenthood of Illinois (PPIL) believes that reproductive self-determination, with effective sexual education and access to family planning and related services, is necessary to enhance the quality of life, preserve individual opportunity and serve the interests of the family.

We realize this mission through three key initiatives:

- Planned Parenthood of Illinois will provide, or cause to be provided, effective reproductive health services, especially for those who do not have adequate resources, in settings which preserve and protect the privacy, dignity and essential rights of the individual.
- Planned Parenthood of Illinois will provide, or cause to be provided, education which ensures an understanding of sexuality and its implications for the individual, the family and society.
- Planned Parenthood of Illinois will initiate, advocate and cause to be implemented, public and private policies which guarantee reproductive self-determination and the services and resources necessary to insure it.

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FISCAL YEAR 2011 - BUILDING HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

For generations, women and men have relied on Planned Parenthood of Illinois. Nearly one in four women in the U.S. has visited a Planned Parenthood health center in her lifetime. For many of our patients, we are the only place they can go to access quality, affordable care.

During 2011 Planned Parenthood faced some of the most severe challenges in our history. Our Near North health center received a package containing a dead possum and a note threatening our doctors. Nine anti-choice bills aimed at limiting access to essential women's health care were introduced in the Illinois General Assembly. In the spring of 2011, federal legislators came close to shutting down the government over disputes about Planned Parenthood funding.

Despite the challenges we faced, we are proud to have expanded our health and education services. We continue to lead the way in building healthy communities across Illinois.

Among our many efforts is an initiative to give our health centers a cohesive new look, which will increase our patients' comfort level and reflect the high quality care we provide. We are creating new ways to use technology to expand access to underserved populations and we are expanding our community education programs.

With your support we will continue working to increase our reach to all communities in need of health care so that every woman, man and teenager in our state has the opportunity to be healthy and stay healthy.

PROVIDING ACCESS TO SAFE, AFFORDABLE HEALTH CARE

BY THE NUMBERS

- Distributed 1,515 female condoms and 637,204 male condoms
- Enrolled 8,821 women in Illinois Healthy Women
- Administered 16,735 breast exams, 11,755 pap smears, and 761 colposcopy and LEEP procedures
- Provided 27,749 emergency contraceptives and 19,861 pregnancy tests

During FY11, Planned Parenthood of Illinois operated seventeen community-based health centers - nine in the metropolitan Chicago area and eight in central Illinois.

67,500 patients received healthcare services at Planned Parenthood health centers and we provided \$1.6 million worth of charity care. No patient was turned away because she or he was unable to pay.

The most recent data available indicates that in Illinois, births resulting from unintended pregnancy cost the public \$512 million. It is estimated that without publically funded family planning programs, of which Planned Parenthood of Illinois is a significant provider, these costs would be 60% higher. During the last year these programs saved the federal government and the states \$3.4 billion in Medicaid costs for prenatal, delivery and infant care.

Contraception returns four dollars for every dollar spent. Few healthcare investments offer a broader impact on the lives of women, men and children or greater return on donations than sexual and reproductive health.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Started offering ella, an FDA-approved emergency contraception pill
- Increased access to cervical cancer prevention by expanding colposcopy and LEEP services
- Increased access to long-acting reversible contraceptives such as IUDs and single rod implants

ENSURING OUR YOUTH RECEIVE MEDICALLY ACCURATE, COMPREHENSIVE AND AGE-APPROPRIATE SEXUAL EDUCATION

BY THE NUMBERS

- Reached a total of 20,092 participants with our education programs- 61% of them age 13-19, 53% of whom were female and 47% of whom were male
- Reached 955 parent participants and 488 teacher participants
- Distributed 30,000 condoms
- Referred 5,000 patients to family planning services through our educational programs
- Hosted 777 Educational Sessions- 40% in classrooms and 11% in community/social service agencies
- Trained 52 Teen Awareness Group (TAG) educators across Illinois to provide sexual education to their peers as well parents and community groups

Educational programs prevent unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) by helping people - particularly teens - develop healthy, responsible attitudes and behaviors regarding sexuality.

Planned Parenthood of Illinois' education program provides culturally sensitive, age-appropriate programs in schools, Department of Human Services offices and community centers. Community education efforts focus on raising visibility about the full range of health services provided by Planned Parenthood of Illinois. Often, our education staff members are the "face" of Planned Parenthood. They must be up-to-date on the latest medical and health center practices, and they must effectively communicate the needs of Planned Parenthood's patients.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Sponsored Illinois youth team members' attendance at the Youth Policy and Organizing Summit in Washington, D.C. where they met with Senators Dick Durbin and Roland Burris and Congresswoman Debbie Halvorson and attended an event with House Speaker Nancy Pelosi
- Participated in National Day to Prevent Teen Pregnancy, Take Action Tour concert and the Get Yourself Tested Campaign to help educate Illinois communities
- Held teen clinic days in several health centers across the state

CREATING AWARENESS AND ACTIVISM WITHIN OUR COMMUNITIES TO PROTECT REPRODUCTIVE AND CIVIL RIGHTS

BY THE NUMBERS

- Made 76,733 phone calls and mailed 5,384 letters supporting PPIL's mission
- Supported by 4,520 dedicated volunteers who donated 14,941 hours to PPIL
- 7,745 Advocates for Choice members hosted and participated in 171 Advocates for Choice campus activities
- Tracked 309 legislative measures including the 9 anti-choice bills that we defeated successfully
- Increased activist list by 35,000 – raising our list of Illinois activists to more than 100,000 members

The Planned Parenthood of Illinois Public Policy program advocates for common sense public policies in Illinois that ensure access to health care and protect the reproductive health and rights of women, teens, and families. On a limited budget and with the help of nearly 350 volunteers, Planned Parenthood of Illinois posted a robust record of accomplishment during FY2011.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Collaborated with coalition partners such as the Responsible Budget Coalition and Illinois Partners for Human Services to ensure family planning services were included in the state budget
- Defeated all nine pieces of anti-choice legislation introduced in the Illinois State General Assembly
- Supported the passage of comprehensive sex education bill HB3027—the PREP Act, which will require that any sex education taught in a public school must be age-appropriate, medically accurate, and comprehensive
- Participated in the Campaign for Reproductive Health and Access to raise public awareness about reproductive justice issues in Illinois
- Hired a community organizer for the suburban Chicago area who works to increase visibility and participation within Latino communities in suburban areas



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
REVENUE FISCAL YEAR 2011
