

Our Mission

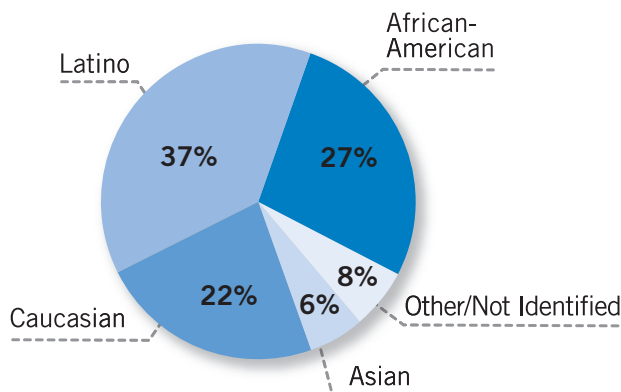
To empower individuals to make independent, informed decisions about their sexual and reproductive lives, Planned Parenthood of New York City provides information and health care, and promotes public policies that make those services available to all.

Our Health Center Clients

- In 2014, nearly 50,000 clients made 84,159 visits to our four health centers.
- In 2014, 72% of our clients were under the age of 30 and the vast majority were women.
- Our clients are diverse: In 2014, 27% were African-American, 37% Latino, 22% Caucasian, 6% Asian, and 8% Other/Not Identified.
- 62% of our clients in 2014 were insured by Medicaid, paid reduced rates, or received our services for free.

Our Role in the Community

Reproductive Health Services

At our four health centers in Manhattan, Brooklyn, the Bronx, and Staten Island, highly trained professionals provide state-of-the-art reproductive health care. Whether the people we serve need contraception, a pregnancy test, abortion counseling and services, or a test for a sexually transmitted infection, we're here for our

clients — regardless of their age, immigration status, or ability to pay. Our health center staff is prepared to serve diverse communities. Medical interpretation and translated materials are available for non-English-speaking clients.

Clinical Training and Research Initiative

Our Clinical Training and Research Initiative (CTRI) provides training in sexual and reproductive health services to a wide range of health care professionals including physicians, nurses, certified nurse-midwives, physician assistants, and nurse practitioners. This training addresses the critical shortage of clinicians able to provide abortion services and expands the number of clinicians trained in the full range of sexual and reproductive health services. CTRI is also a strategic leader in clinical research, contributing to the provision of evidence-based medicine.

PPNYC's Focus on Teens

We are collaborating with the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to help adolescents get health services. PPNYC's Bronx Center participates in Bronx Teen Connection, whose social workers act as liaisons between two Bronx schools and our Bronx Center. In addition, PPNYC's Education and Training Department joins our health centers in hosting Center Teen Nights, where teens participate in a workshop conducted by our Teen Advocates, tour the health center, and are encouraged to schedule an appointment for a future visit.

Long-Acting Reversible Contraception

In keeping with evidence-based best practices regarding contraceptives, PPNYC has seen an increased number of patients requesting long-acting reversible contraception (LARC) — including intrauterine devices (IUDs) and the contraceptive implant — both in our family planning and abortion services. In 2014, 8,229 clients opted for a LARC method. We are grateful to the Jerome L. Greene Foundation for a grant that has increased access to LARC methods by covering their cost for uninsured patients who pay out-of-pocket.

Project Street Beat

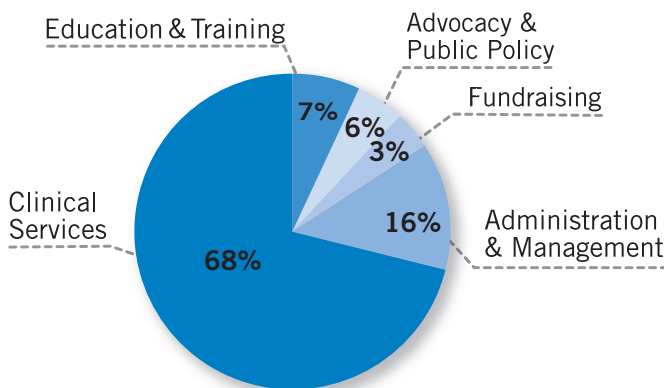
Project Street Beat is an innovative client-focused, street-based HIV prevention and linkage-to-care program whose services are free of charge. It's known for its success in reaching individuals at high risk for HIV who don't typically access health care through traditional venues and those living with HIV but disengaged from medical care. Project Street Beat offers a range of medical services on a mobile medical unit, and rapid HIV testing and risk reduction counseling for high-risk HIV-negative individuals. For people living with HIV, Project Street Beat offers expedited linkage to HIV primary care, harm reduction services, case management, and supportive services. In 2014, Project Street Beat had more than 27,000 service encounters, including more than 4,500 HIV rapid tests.

Affordable Services

No one is turned away from PPNYC if he or she cannot pay. We know that some of our clients turn to PPNYC as their only source of health care. We help eligible uninsured clients to obtain public insurance or screen them for eligibility for our sliding fee scale. Each of our health centers has counselors who help clients enroll in public insurance programs such as Medicaid, Child Health Plus, and the Family Planning Benefit Program and in Qualified Health Plans through the New York State of Health Marketplace.

Spending Where It Counts

Planned Parenthood of New York City spends \$.68 of every dollar contributed on providing a wide range of clinical services.



Services We Provide

- Birth control
- Pregnancy tests (free and available by walk-in) and options counseling
- Emergency contraception (Plan B One-Step is available on a walk-in basis. Anyone, regardless of age, can get emergency contraception. Other forms of emergency contraception are available by appointment.)
- GYN care and cervical and breast cancer screening
- Colposcopy
- Testing and counseling for sexually transmitted infections, including HIV
- HPV vaccine to prevent cervical cancer
- Surgical abortion and medication abortion
- Male reproductive health exams
- Teen services
- Health insurance screening and enrollment

- Successfully helped 8,354 clients obtain public insurance
- 51,572 sexual and reproductive health visits
- 84,094 tests for sexually transmitted infections
- 569 HPV vaccines
- 25,997 HIV tests
- 7,867 Pap tests to screen for cervical cancer
- 8,530 pregnancy tests
- Our health centers provided 18,648 abortions – 91% in the first trimester
- 32% of all abortions were medication abortions
