Facts about Minor Consent for Medical Treatment in Oklahoma

On November 1st, 2014, a new law went into effect in Oklahoma, limiting access to certain medical treatments for some minors (under the age of 18), unless they have the consent of a parent or legal guardian.

How do you know if this applies to you?

You DO NOT need to have your parent or legal guardian sign a consent if:

- You are on Medicaid.
- You are married, have a dependent child, or are emancipated.
- You are or have been pregnant.
- You are separated from your parents or legal guardian and are not supported by them.
- You are requesting only testing or treatment for certain sexually transmitted infections.
- You are requesting pregnancy testing only.
- You are requesting services from a Title X-funded clinic. Clinics in our service are that are Title X-funded are:
 - Planned Parenthood of Central Oklahoma, Midwest City clinic, Thursdays only
 - County Health Departments

We CAN provide the following to minors without parental consent:

- Condoms
- Contraceptive foam or film
- Information about birth control
- Pregnancy testing
- Diagnosis /testing and treatment for certain sexually transmitted diseases
- Emergency Contraception for 17-year-olds

To OBTAIN parental consent:

- Have your parent or legal guardian accompany you to your clinic appointment prepared to read and sign the consent form; or
- Have your parent or legal guardian read this form carefully and sign it, and bring the form with you to your clinic appointment.
