It's an exciting time for our nation. In January, the final phase of Obamacare will go into effect, which means millions of Americans will have health insurance for the first time in their lives. Those of us who provide health care understand that greater access leads to better health outcomes. And better health outcomes means stronger communities.

This is especially true when it comes to women's health. Nearly 12 million currently uninsured women between the ages of 19 and 44 years old are now able to sign up for new, affordable health insurance plans.

From the very beginning, President Obama invited Planned Parenthood to the table to discuss how to make health care reform equitable for women. Our national president, Cecile Richards, was a strong voice for women, making it clear that pregnancy or domestic abuse should not be considered "pre-existing conditions." She told the president that it was patently unfair to charge up to 150 percent more for women's care than for men's health coverage. Planned Parenthood advocated for preventive care—including well-woman exams, cervical cancer screenings, and birth control—with no co-pay.

Planned Parenthood was heard. Obamacare has been crafted with sensitivity toward women's health that is not only the right thing to do, but the smart thing. Preventive care yields both social and economic benefits that help build stronger communities and a healthier country.

Obamacare also provides consumer protections for everyone, so insurance companies can't refuse to cover people or cancel their insurance when they're sick. And they have to cover the services that are important to people, including prescription drugs, doctor visits and hospitalization. Additionally, young people under age 26 can now stay on their parents' insurance, meaning no more gaps in coverage between school and a job with health benefits.

Many people have asked me how Obamacare will impact Planned Parenthood. As a mission-driven organization, Planned Parenthood is delighted that more Americans will have access to care. Many of our current patients already have health insurance and choose Planned Parenthood. And we are actively engaging our patients by providing information about how they can enroll in a plan that best suits their needs. We also know that not all people are eligible for insurance through Obamacare and we will continue to serve them, too. In short, we will continue to provide care, no matter what.

from the Board Chair

When I share with people that I am the chair of the Board of Directors at Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest, I get two reactions. Many friends share their concerns about the legislative attacks on reproductive and sexual health. The other response is the more common one. Women thank me for my work with Planned Parenthood. They often whisper that Planned Parenthood was there for them when they personally were in need.

One in five women in the United States will visit a Planned Parenthood health center at some point in her life. In San Diego, one-third of all households have a former or current Planned Parenthood patient. This shows that we have earned the trust of women and their families. We've been here for women, men, and teens when they need us most.

In fact, last year, Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest provided care for more than 142,000 patients through more than 300,000 visits. Most of those visits (95%) were for preventive care like cervical and breast cancer screenings, testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections, contraception, and reliable health care education. These are impressive figures indeed, but what gives me a special sense of fulfillment is looking beyond the numbers and thinking about the lives of the women and men we have changed and, in some cases, saved.

Recently, at our City Heights Express Center, a patient came to us after she had been beaten by her boyfriend. She didn't have an appointment for a medical visit, but had come to us for treatment in the past and knew our caring staff. She remembered that we had always asked her about intimate partner violence or coercion, and said that we were the only ones who ever asked that question. She knew she could turn to us for help.

Unfortunately, intimate partner violence is a widespread problem, which is why our providers are highly trained in detecting and reporting it. At our Mission Valley Express Center, one of our center managers witnessed a husband pushing his wife in the hallway as their 3-year-old child looked on. It was a very sad situation, but one that was made better because of our intervention.

We are saving lives in many ways. Planned Parenthood is a leading provider of cervical, breast, and prostate cancer screening. At our Euclid Avenue Francis Torbert Center, one of our clinicians recently detected a tumor on a patient's cervix and suspected it was cancer. The young woman had just moved to San Diego and was understandably terrified, a feeling that was compounded by not having a network of local friends and resources. She appreciated Planned Parenthood for providing low-cost screening and an immediate referral to a gynecologic oncologist who performed the surgery she needed.

Our patients are so grateful that Planned Parenthood is there to provide care no matter what. And I am grateful to you, our generous donors who make our work possible. Together we are making great changes in the lives of people in our community. Thank you for all you do to support the mission of Planned Parenthood.

California leads the way in creating greater access to care

California continues to lead the nation in ensuring access to women's health, bucking the national trend to limit women's health care programs and abortion rights. Governor Jerry Brown has signed into law Assembly Bills 154 and 980, which increase access to essential health care.

Authored by Assembly Majority Floor Leader Toni Atkins (D-San Diego), AB 154 improves abortion access so women can receive care from providers they trust in their own communities.

The bill is based on a six-year study conducted by the University of California, San Francisco, and published in *The American Journal of Public Health* in January. The study showed that specially trained nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives, and physician assistants can safely provide high-quality early abortion care.

More than half of California's counties still lack an accessible abortion provider, and as a result, many women delay treatment because they have to travel long distances or raise money for transportation and services. When it becomes law in January, AB 154 will also help women overcome other barriers, such as long wait times for appointments. This is an important step toward ensuring politics and geography do not interfere with the medical decisions that belong to a woman and her health care provider.

Our second priority bill, AB 980, authored by Assembly Member Richard Pan, M.D., eliminates several arcane regulations tied to abortion service. The new law ensures that all primary care clinics in the state, including those that provide abortion care, are held to the same building standards.

California is showing the rest of the country that this is not the time to go backward on access to safe and legal abortion. Governor Brown signed these two bills into law at a time when Planned Parenthood is fighting in statehouses and courthouses across the country against policies that would take women back to the 1950s, making this victory for California women all the more important. As we look to 2014, Planned Parenthood will continue to fight for legislation that protects and expands access to preventive and reproductive health for all women.

The President's *Council*

The Generous Core of Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest

The President's Council is a vital group of dedicated individuals committed to sustaining Planned Parenthood's ability to serve the women, men, and families in our three-county region.

Members give \$1,000 or more annually and provide the core support that fuels every one of our services, from vaccines and ultrasounds to teacher trainings and security. This year, the President's Council has contributed nearly \$3.5 million to our affiliate!

Planned *Giving*

Transferring your IRA distribution is a great way to make a gift to Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest.

Early this year President Obama approved an extension of the IRA Charitable Rollover through 2013. Unfortunately, despite its popularity, it is unknown if the extension will continue in 2014. Under the law, those who are 70½ or older can give away as much as \$100,000 a year from their individual retirement accounts directly to eligible charities—including Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest—without having to include any of the transfer as part of their gross income. The transfer must be made directly from the IRA to the organization.

Transfers count toward that person's required minimum distribution for the year and must be completed by December 31, 2013 for the 2013 tax year.
