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MISSION STATEMENT

Planned Parenthood of Illinois (PPII) believes that reproductive self-determination, with effective sexuality education and access to family planning and related services, is necessary to enhance the quality of life, preserve individual opportunity and serve the interests of the family.

BASED ON THIS BELIEF, PPIL'S MISSION IS TO:

- Provide, or cause to be provided, effective reproductive health services, especially for those who do not have adequate resources in settings which preserve and protect the privacy, dignity and essential rights of the individual.
- Provide, or cause to be provided, education which ensures an understanding of sexuality and its implications for the individual, the family and society.
- Initiate, advocate and cause to be implemented, public and private policies which guarantee reproductive self-determination and the services and resources necessary to insure it.

At Planned Parenthood of Illinois we know that trust is the cornerstone of our success. For more than 60 years, Illinois women, men and teens have counted on us to compassionately provide health care information and services that prevent unintended pregnancies and reduce the risk of sexually transmitted infections. They have also counted on us to perform life-saving cancer screenings and treatment. The communities we serve trust us because we focus on preventive services that help women and men stay healthy.

Despite the constant threat of government funding cuts, fiscal year 2010 was no exception. In this recession, our health centers continued to welcome women and men who had lost jobs and insurance coverage. We maintained vital programs that educate and inspire because we know they are essential to building healthy families and communities. We advocated for reproductive freedom at state and national levels. And we celebrated the bittersweet victory of national health care reform, which brings relief to millions of uninsured women and families but also establishes formidable obstacles to coverage for abortion-related care.

We also focused on the future of PPIL. Two years after five affiliates merged into one statewide organization, PPIL's Board and staff embarked on a nine-month journey to develop a three-year strategic plan that is visionary, thoughtful and forward-looking.

Our vision is that all sexually active women in Illinois will have access to comprehensive reproductive health care that is equal, safe, convenient and affordable; that teens and youth in Illinois will receive comprehensive, medically accurate, age-appropriate sex education; and that PPIL will set the tone of the public debate on issues of healthy sexuality, reproductive choice and the need for family planning services for all Illinois residents.

We look forward to working with our supporters, volunteers and community partners to translate this ambitious plan into reality. And most of all we look forward to continue being there for every person, every family and every community in years to come.

WE'RE HERE TO MAKE COMMUNITIES HEALTHIER

For more than 60 years, building healthy communities has been Planned Parenthood's mission. Illinois women, men and teens know they can count on us for high-quality health care regardless of race, gender, age or economic status.

Our health care services include life-saving cancer screenings, breast health care, annual exams, contraceptive services, sexually transmitted infection (STI) testing and treatment and much more. Over 90% of the services we provide are preventive services that help women, families and communities stay healthy.

FISCAL YEAR 2010

This year we served more than 60,000 patients, 59% of whom live at or below the federal poverty level and would otherwise not have access to quality reproductive health care.

We also upgraded our Springfield Health Center to better accommodate our patients. Renovations at the health center allowed us to introduce medication abortion and LEEP (Loop Electrosurgical Excision Procedure) for treatment of abnormal pap results in Sangamon County for the first time. It was a major milestone for reproductive health care in Illinois!

In an effort to help reduce STI rates, all 17 PPIL health centers started offering Expedited Partner Therapy (EPT) when it went into effect in Illinois on January 1, 2010. Patients who test positive for chlamydia or gonorrhea can now provide treatment for their partners without a separate medical visit.

LOOKING AHEAD

One in four women will visit a Planned Parenthood in her lifetime. Our goal over the next three years is to expand our services and rebrand and upgrade our health centers to ensure that we will continue to be there for Illinois women not only once in her life, but over her lifetime.

We also plan to expand our partnerships with local organizations so that Illinois women, men and teens will have better access to quality reproductive health care services. We will make it a priority to establish partnerships with Federally Qualified Health Centers, city and county health departments and other health care and social service organizations.

And we will continue to remove barriers to access of reproductive health care by expanding into additional underserved communities. In fiscal year 2013 we will use information from a statewide study to assess where the need for reproductive health care is greatest in Illinois.



WE'RE HERE TO PROVIDE THE MOST SOPHISTICATED INSTRUMENT IN MEDICINE: ACCURATE INFORMATION

Illinois women, men and teens rely on Planned Parenthood to give them the accurate information they need to stay healthy and safe. Young people, especially, benefit from access to facts and information about their own bodies.

We provide an open door to teens who may not have an adult to answer questions, and to the adults who may not have all the answers. And we are invited to schools and community youth groups because educators know that Planned Parenthood offers age-appropriate, comprehensive sexuality education.

FISCAL YEAR 2010

This year we provided comprehensive sex education to nearly 24,000 women, men and teens through our Community Education Department and Teen Awareness Groups (TAG).

Three teams of TAG educators were awarded scholarships to go to Washington D.C. to attend Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) Youth Policy and Organizing Conference and Young Leaders Summit. As a result of attending these conferences, one of the TAG teens was chosen to represent PPIL and Illinois youth on PPFA's National Youth Advisory Board.

We also expanded our reach in Springfield and Decatur. We trained teachers in Springfield on sexuality education curriculum for their classrooms and TAG educators in Decatur were chosen to make a teen pregnancy prevention commercial with 411 TeenHealth. The commercial aired on BET and Nick at Night for over 10 months.

LOOKING AHEAD

In the coming years, we plan to expand and increase the visibility of our peer education program. Currently, PPIL has TAG programs in Bloomington, Champaign and Decatur. In the next three years, we hope to expand our reach to additional communities in Illinois.

We also plan to evaluate our peer education program to ensure that success is measured scientifically. We want to measure the quantitative impact our programming has on knowledge, attitudes and behaviors.

Finally, we plan to enhance the connection between community education, health centers and the broader community. Our education staff will continue to have the most current knowledge of our services and reproductive health care. And we will work to expand our networks into communities to broaden our reach with educational programming.



WE'RE HERE TO STAND UP FOR WOMEN'S HEALTH, FOR ACCESS AND SAFETY AND FOR REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM

Planned Parenthood will always protect women's health and reproductive freedoms. We guard the rights of all women to make decisions about their bodies and stand on the front lines as champions for community access to information and medical care.

Every person in this country should have access to high-quality affordable health care and to be able to make decisions about their health based on medical facts and not based on whether they can afford the care they need.

FISCAL YEAR 2010

This year we worked tirelessly to help pass meaningful health care reform that protects and enhances access to women's health care. We were disappointed that abortion became a highly politicized issue in the closing days of the debate, but women's health care—and all health care—will be more affordable and accessible as a result of this landmark legislation.

We also celebrated a victory when the Chicago City Council passed the Bubble Zone Ordinance, a law which helps to protect patients, staff and volunteers from harassment and intimidation when entering or exiting any medical facility, including our health centers.

Our growing network of activists and volunteers helped make our successes a reality. Volunteers made phone calls, wrote letters and collected petition signatures to advocate for reproductive health care rights in Illinois. They donated a total of 15,418 hours this year—a 73% increase from fiscal year 2009.

LOOKING AHEAD

In the next three years we will continue to promote an agenda to advance reproductive freedom in Illinois. We will be there to educate the public and convert educated citizens into motivated activists.

We also plan on strengthening and broadening our public policy agenda by deepening our activist base and expanding our partnership activities on the state and local level. We will continue to grow our list of coalition partners and cultivate new grassroots activists across the state.

Our activist base has already started growing with the implementation of a Waiting Room Advocacy Program—a program designed to build activists from PPIL's patient base. A pilot project in fiscal year 2010 was very successful—95% of patients reached signed up to become activists!






