You have told your stories of what a difference Planned Parenthood has made in your life. You've supported our work with generous gifts, attended rallies, signed petitions, volunteered your time, and escorted PPNNE patients past lines of protestors so they can get the care they need.

2015 – A YEAR IN REVIEW

What a year it has been!

As you know, this year Planned Parenthood of Northern New England has seen unprecedented attacks and challenges to our work. But we've also had incredible triumphs - thanks to you!

Fraudulent videos designed to mislead the public and lawmakers led to unwarranted investigations and efforts to defund the work you care about.

Locally, the NH Executive Council voted to slash more than \$600,000 of PPNNE's funding over the next 2 years. Our opponents are attempting to do the same in Maine right now.

This fall, our Claremont, NH health center was horribly vandalized with a hatchet and spray paint causing thousands of dollars of damage. We responded quickly, making sure our patients got health care at other PPNNE health centers until we could reopen.

DONOR PROFILE: JOE AND DOTTIE HIGHLAND

We greatly appreciate the generosity of PPNNE supporters, like you, who stand by us through our challenges and triumphs. After the New Hampshire Executive Council's decision to strip more than \$600,000 of our funding over the next two years, many in the community reached out to us with gifts, messages of support and volunteer time. Joe and Dottie Highland, of the Highland-Mills Foundation, are some who gave an emergency gift to PPNNE following this defunding. Here is an interview with Joe about their decision to make a special grant to PPNNE:

HOW LONG HAVE YOU AND DOTTIE BEEN SUPPORTERS OF PLANNED PARENTHOOD?

We've supported Planned Parenthood at the national level for over ten years, but had never given to PPNNE before. We had never seen a situation like this that made us act on an emergency basis. I don't agree with the decision to defund PPNNE, neither does Dottie, neither do our kids. We talked about it as a family. The donation was based on a very strong feeling that women's health care shouldn't suffer because of what I believe is a political decision, and one that doesn't think about the women who need health care.

WHAT WAS GOING THROUGH YOUR MIND WHEN YOU HEARD ABOUT THE NH EXECUTIVE COUNCIL DECISION TO DEFUND US?

I heard about it on NPR and I was appalled—both because we strongly feel women should have the care they deserve and appalled because we are NH residents. The votes to defund PPNNE and not provide women with real options for health care struck us as outrageous and inconsistent with good public health, and very, very wrong.

YOU HOPED YOUR DONATION COULD BE USED TO INSPIRE OTHERS. WHAT WOULD YOU LIKE TO SAY TO OTHER PPNNE SUPPORTERS?

I would urge PPNNE supporters to help overcome the deficit created by the NH Executive Council, in order to ensure the 12,000 patients in NH get the

health care they need. When you are as fortunate as Dottie and I are, and able to afford the health care services we need, we have to ensure the actions we take help provide services to people who are less able. To me, that's a fundamental tenet. We've been fortunate, and we've worked very hard—but that doesn't make me any more deserving of health care than someone who hasn't had the same opportunities or successes. We as a community and as a country need to look out for each other. If we fail to do that, we harm the individual and there are family repercussions. That's why we gave money and that's why I would urge others to help make up the deficit.

I STAND WITH PLANNED PARENTHOOD... BECAUSE PLANNED PARENTHOOD STANDS WITH ME.

We recently received this incredibly moving story from a supporter and patient, who gave us permission to share it. It is because of supporters like you that this person was able to access our expert, compassionate care. We hope as you read this story, you know that your support makes our work possible. Thank you.

I stand with Planned Parenthood for many reasons. One of the reasons is that Planned Parenthood, I found out firsthand, stands with me.

Two years ago, my ex-husband stopped by my house and told me he had AIDS. I was shocked and sad. It was not until he left that I did the math. We had been divorced just short of ten years ago.

I did some research and found out that it was in the realm of possibility that I could have been infected, as the HIV virus can take up to ten years to present. It was unlikely, but it frightened me. I was terrified.

I spoke confidentially to some close friends, all of whom recommended I get tested right away. I called my gynecologist. They offered a test, but the results were not as fast as I wanted. Someone told me there was a rapid test available, so I called a local organization that offered HIV testing. The man on the phone was not helpful, and frankly, didn't seem to care very much about my fears or my strong desire to get immediate results. They were not testing that day, he said.

Then I called Planned Parenthood. They told me I could come right in.

I had been to the Burlington health center before, but as a donor, as a tourist. This time I entered as a very frightened, very vulnerable client.

The women who greeted me were kind and efficient. The office was sparkling and clean. I waited for 10 minutes. Then I got the test. And then, very quickly, the results: Negative. Thank God.

I will never forget the way I was treated. Everyone I saw that day was so sympathetic, so gentle, so compassionate, so respectful, so patient. When I got the results, the technicians and I hugged. They knew what was at stake. They got it. It was an incredible experience. No one knew I was a



donor. I could have been anyone. I was anyone. I got just as good care -maybe even better than at my gynecologist's.

I will never forget this experience. Planned Parenthood let me walk in off the street and get the results I needed in a timely, efficient, compassionate manner. It angers me so much that anyone would think of defunding Planned Parenthood. I will stand with Planned Parenthood for many reasons. And while I do, I will remember that when I really, REALLY needed them, Planned Parenthood stood with me.

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
