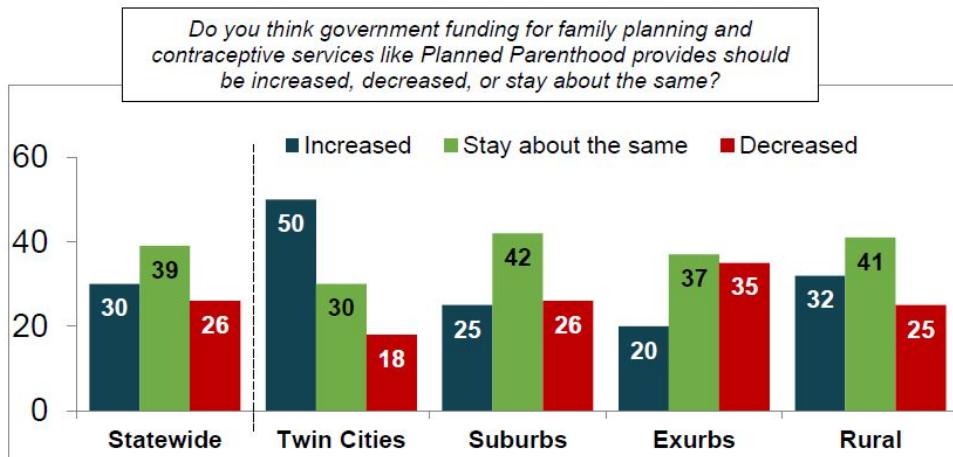
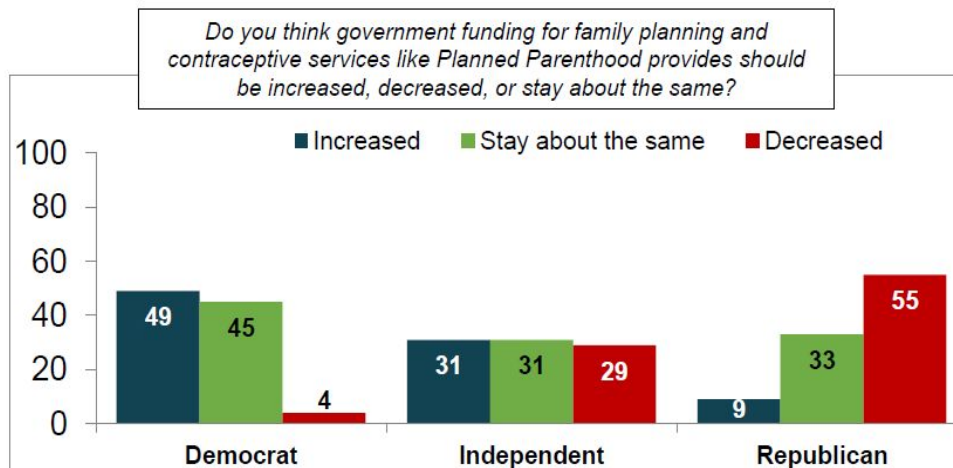


On the issue of government funding for family planning and contraceptive services, a clear majority believe such funding should either be increased (30%) or stay at current levels (39%).

- More than two-in-three voters in the Twin Cities, suburbs, and rural areas favor either existing levels or increased funding for family planning and contraception.



- A plurality of DFL voters support an increase in funding, with 60%+ of Independents favoring increased or stable funding.
- Even 42% of Republicans support funding at higher (9%) or existing (33%) levels.



Anzalone Liszt Grove Research conducted N=450 live telephone interviews with registered voters in Minnesota and a total of N=235 interviews among voters in battleground legislative districts. Interviews were conducted between March 4-9, 2016. Respondents were selected at random, with interviews apportioned geographically based on past voter turnout. Expected margin of sampling error is $\pm 4.6\%$ with a 95% confidence level.
