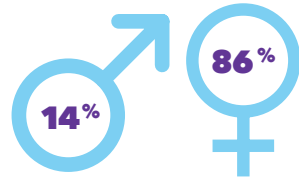




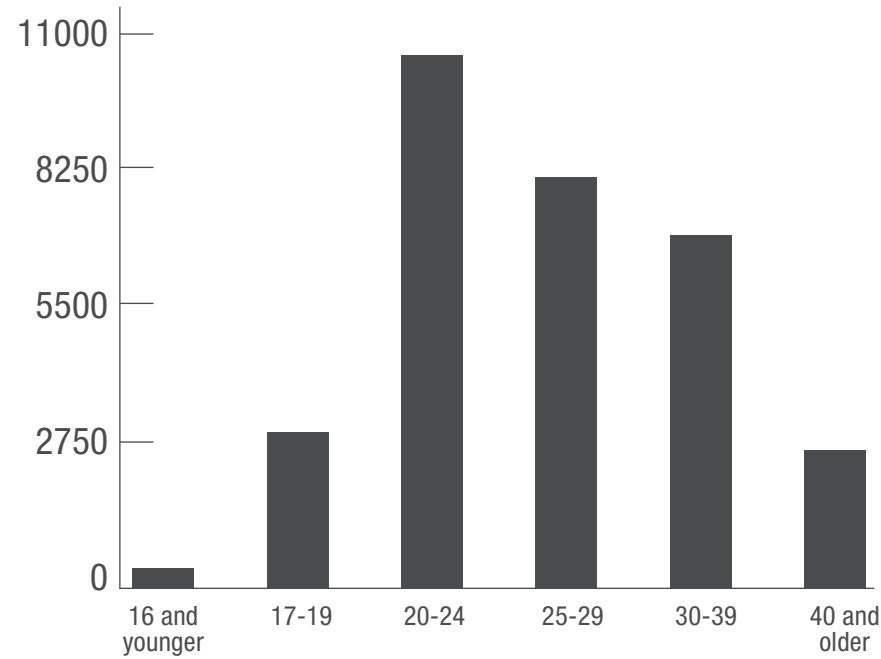

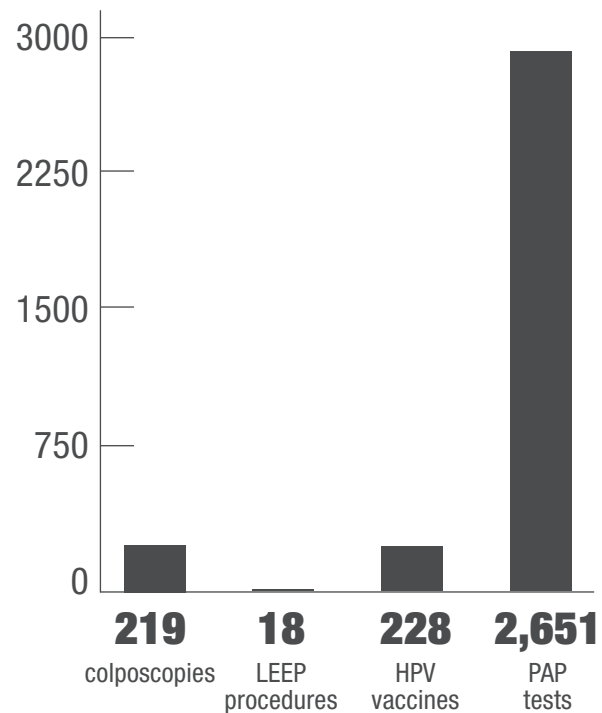

Gardasil vaccine helps prevent human papillomavirus (HPV), a cause of an estimated 75% of cervical cancers and 90% of genital warts.

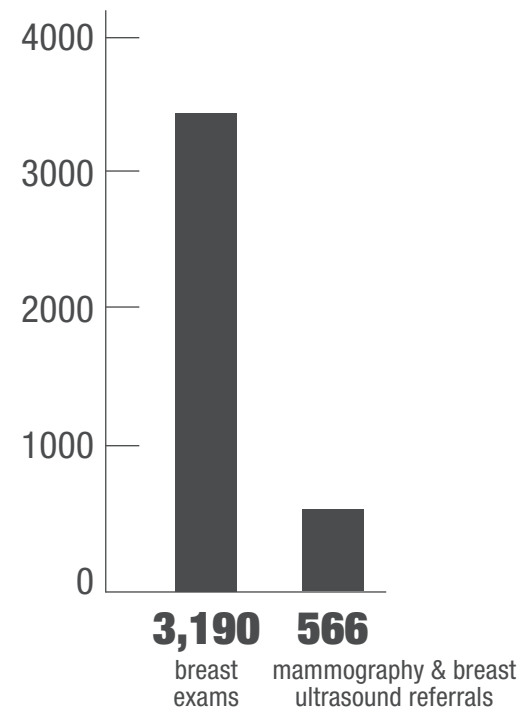
PAP tests, colposcopies, and LEEP procedures represent a progression of cancer detection tests. PAP tests are used for routine screenings. Abnormal findings are evaluated by colposcopies and treated by LEEP procedures.

Regular clinic breast exams by a health care provider are important for finding breast cancer early.

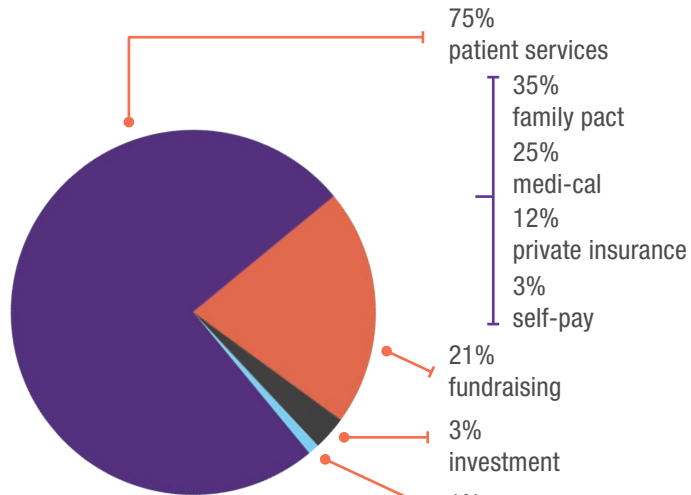
Planned Parenthood continues to recommend that women over 40 get mammograms.

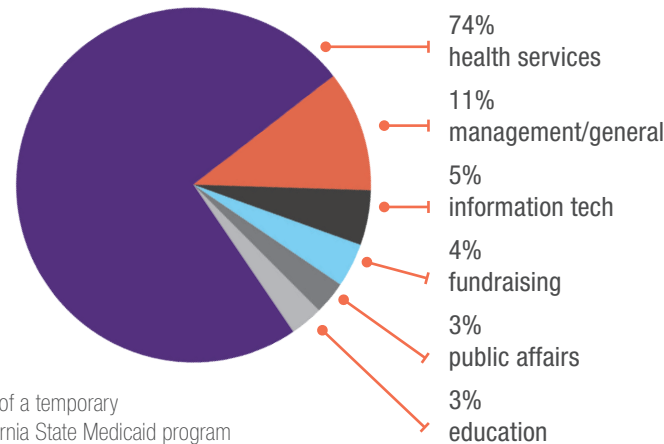

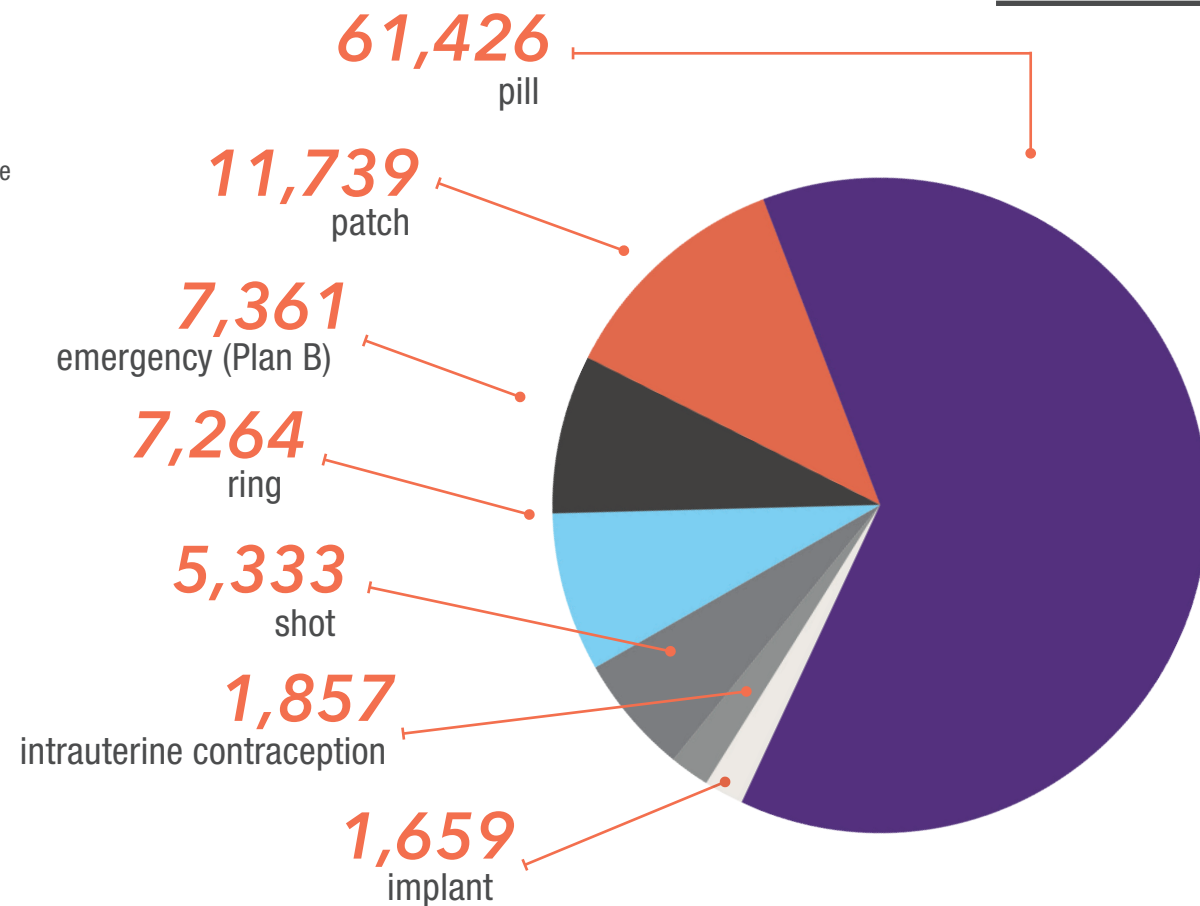
use of funds

\$15,796,975

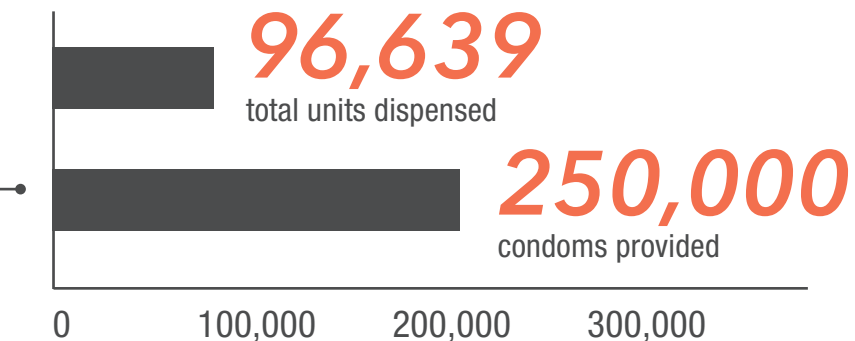


Net Income/Loss \$3,370,148
