PPMM served nearly 250,000 people in FY21

- We provided more than 380,000 patient visits to nearly 174,000 patients
- We reached 69,000 individuals through our Sex Ed programs

PPMM service area includes 35 health centers in 42 counties in California and Nevada

- We are proud to offer services to everyone regardless of their income, identities, immigration status, or beliefs
- PPMM is a safety net provider and is frequently the only provider our patients see. We offer a full range of both preventive and life-saving care including breast and cervical cancer screening, contraception, STI screening, gender affirming care, and wellness visits
- PPMM blazes a path forward for all, such as providing 1/3rd of all the telehealth visits (at an average of 11,000 per month) offered by Planned Parenthoods across the U.S.

PPMM is a frontline provider, with the majority of PPMM's patients coming to us from underserved communities. Many live in rural parts of California, including the Central Valley, and we see a significant number of patients who work or live in Silicon Valley.

- **68% of PPMM patients live at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level of less than \$12,500 annually**
- **91% of PPMM patients live at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level of less than \$24,500 annually**
- 79% of PPMM patients are BIPOC; nearly half are Latinx

We are in the fight of our lives. PPMM is taking strategic action to ensure we have the capacity to support all the patients who walk through our doors, including those who live and work in our affiliate region and those who come to us for the care they cannot obtain in their home states.

Current priorities include:

1. Building new health centers and upgrading aging ones (six projects currently underway)
 - Relocating to larger health centers in West Oakland and San Jose near major transportation hubs where out-of-state patients can easily fly in to nearby.
 - Building a new health center in Reno to support our communities in Northern Nevada and the Tahoe basin region, as well as out-of-state patients for whom Reno is the most accessible location for them to obtain abortion care, and exploring an additional new health center near the Nevada/Utah border.
 - Relocating to a larger facility in Visalia to provide care in one of the biggest "abortion deserts" in the state.
2. Increase access to and reduce stigma of abortion care by training more clinicians and integrating in-health center abortions into more health centers
 - A new study just released by the Guttmacher Institute projects that if Roe falls, there will be a nearly 3,000 percent increase (from a previous 46,000 to 1.4 million) in the number of out-of-state people of reproductive age who would find their nearest abortion care in California. The vast majority would be from Arizona.
 - **PPMM is currently ramping up to serve an estimated additional 250-500 patients per week coming from states where abortion is restricted or prohibited.**



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3. Scaling our sex ed programs through digital learning and through partnerships with other community organizations.
 - a. PPMM recently launched Y-LED, a program in which youth designers (ages 15-24) research, design, and create relevant, impactful, and accessible sex ed content for youth and young adults. Y-led Youth designers gain skills and knowledge related to human-centered design, youth participatory action research, and digital media development.
 - b. The Y-Led team recently rolled out a digital learning platform for comprehensive sex ed for middle and high school students in English and Spanish that is compliant with California and national standards.

Future of Abortion Council

In late 2021, Governor Gavin Newsom declared California a “Reproductive Freedom State” and convened a Future of Abortion Council (FAB) to protect, strengthen, and expand abortion care in the state. PPMM is a key stakeholder among the FAB’s 40 member organizations comprised of sexual and reproductive health care providers, reproductive rights and justice advocacy organizations, legal and policy experts, researchers, and advocates, as well as the Governor and legislative leadership.

PPMM’s Top Legislative Priorities

AB 2134 – The California Abortion and Reproductive Equity (CARE) Act (Assemblymember Dr. Akilah Weber) This bill will establish the California Reproductive Health Equity Program to provide support to California providers who offer uncompensated reproductive health care to patients in the state.

SB 1142 – Support for Practical Assistance Organizations and Infrastructure (Senators Nancy Skinner and Ana Caballero) This bill will require creation of a website for comprehensive information about accessing abortion in California and will create a support mechanism for practical support organizations and Abortion Funds to receive funding for logistical services provided.

AB 1666 – Civil Liability for Abortion Providers (Assemblymember Rebecca Bauer-Kahan) This bill will protect California abortion providers, patients, individuals and organizations that help patients access abortion from civil liability stemming from lawsuits based in hostile anti-abortion laws in other states that interfere with the rights protected under the California Reproductive Privacy Act.

AB 2223 – Decriminalization of Abortion & Pregnancy Loss (Assemblymember Buffy Wicks) This bill will create clear and consistent guidance regarding existing protections under the Reproductive Privacy Act to protect people from prosecutions and criminalization of abortion or pregnancy loss.
