

Dear Friends,

When I became the Board Chair of Planned Parenthood of Illinois (PPIL) in 2017, it was not a quiet time—the federal government was trying to “defund” Planned Parenthood, repeal the Affordable Care Act, and chip away at a number of basic civil rights. I wasn’t scared; I was ready. I was ready because I knew that more than 68,000 patients rely on PPIL for their care and I wasn’t going to let anything stop me from fighting for them. And, because the women who raised me taught me to be ready.

I come from a family of strong women. In 1937, at a time when golfing for African Americans was not a thing—especially not for women—my great-grandmother, a professional golfer, founded the Chicago Women’s Golf Club. She taught me to always fight for what I know is right, no matter what barriers are in the way and to speak up when I know something is wrong. I proudly built on that legacy in my time as Board Chair at PPIL during a moment in history when it has never been more important to step up and stand up for our patients and for reproductive rights.

This past year, we lived through unparalleled assaults on Planned Parenthood and an individual’s right to make informed, independent decisions about health, sex, and family planning. That’s why Planned Parenthood continues to fight for a world where all people have the freedom and opportunity to control their own lives. PPIL remains driven by our mission to pursue reproductive freedom for those who do not have it, and we are willing to put everything we have into the effort.

When I joined the Board my goal always centered on expanding the mission of Planned Parenthood. I’m proud that in 2018 we were able to open a new health center in Flossmoor that specifically met the needs of a community that needed our services. I am inspired by the number of people, especially young people, who are standing up every day to ensure the laws and freedoms they have grown up with are not taken away. Those willing to fight every day inspire me and let me know the work I’ve been doing for many years is meaningful. I look forward to seeing the incredible progress that Planned Parenthood will continue to fight for, as PPIL provides high-quality, compassionate care for those who need it most.

Dear Friends,

Nearly 30 years ago, I worked as a health care assistant at Planned Parenthood because its mission spoke to me: the idea that this organization empowered people to make independent, informed decisions about their sexual and reproductive lives was inspiring. Empowering people remains our core mission and I'm still inspired as we continue to fight each and every day at Planned Parenthood of Illinois (PPIL).

PPIL is here for people whose access to health care and reproductive rights has too long been denied—those with low incomes, those who live in rural areas, or who are young, people of color, immigrants, people of different faiths, or folks who are just afraid to get the health care they need. Barriers to accessing reproductive health care often means opportunities curtailed. That is why we are committed to providing access to quality care and meeting patients where they are.

As I reflect on my first year back at PPIL, I am so proud that we provided high-quality health care, without judgment, to more than 68,000 patients and opened our doors to more than 105,000 visits at our 17 health centers across the state. This past year, we improved access to reproductive health care by opening our new Flossmoor Health Center; provided medically accurate sex education and STI testing to more than 13,000 young people; and protected access to care by advocating for policies and laws that increase access to care and protect patients from discrimination.

In an important legislative victory last year, HB 40 became law! This significant piece of legislation ensures that women seeking safe and legal abortion in Illinois can no longer be discriminated against based on how much they earn, where, or even whether they work. And it stops abortion from automatically becoming illegal if Roe v. Wade is overturned by the Supreme Court.

Planned Parenthood was founded on the revolutionary idea that women should have access to the information and care they need to live strong, healthy lives and to fulfill their dreams. This past year highlights our incredible foundational strengths—including our outstanding services and our ability to weather obstacles and leverage change. We continue with courage and commitment to ensure our patients can access the care they need, now and in the future.






Protecting Patients in Illinois

In an incredible victory for reproductive rights, PPIL celebrated the passage of HB 40, which reverses the “trigger” law language and allows the use of Medicaid funds and state employees insurance to access abortion care.

This success means that people will have access to safe and legal abortion in Illinois, no matter their income level, type of insurance, or even if the US Supreme Court overturns a woman’s right to choose.

Additionally, with community activists, legislative champions, and peer advocacy organizations, PPIL succeeded in moving three key policy positions into law.

- Changes to the School code require public and charter schools to provide reasonable **accommodations to breastfeeding students on campus** allowing young mothers time and a private space to breastfeed or express milk while remaining in school without suffering any academic penalty.
- The newly amended Perinatal HIV Prevention Act adds a third trimester **HIV test for pregnant women**. This new legislation works to ensure that no child in Illinois is born HIV-positive.
- The Learn with Dignity Act guarantees the **availability of feminine hygiene products on school campuses, at no cost to students**--ensuring young women and girls can focus on learning instead of facing the stigma of not being able to take care of their personal needs.

All three laws became effective on January 1, 2018.

JULY 2017


Protecting the ACA

Planned Parenthood's network of supporters defeated efforts to repeal the Affordable Care Act, which would have jeopardized health care access for the nearly 50 percent of PPIL patients who rely on public health coverage programs to access basic, preventive reproductive health care services.

Back to School

PPIL provided medically accurate sex education and confidential STI testing to nearly 14,000 young people through the Chicago Healthy Adolescents and Teens (CHAT) program.

AUGUST 2017



My Body My Story

PPIL launched *My Body. My. Story.*, the digital marketing component of the Teen Birth Control Access Campaign, to debunk myths, smash stigmas, and alleviate anxiety youth feel when discussing birth control and sexual health.

Flossmoor Health Center

PPIL opened a new state-of-the-art health center in Flossmoor, which provides the full range of reproductive and sexual health services.



APRIL 2017

PPIL Lobby Days

PPIL advocated in Springfield and Washington D.C. for important reproductive health and rights priorities including access to care and education, Title X, the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Program, and Medicaid.



MAY 2018

Equal Rights Amendment

Illinois became the 37th state to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.



HB 40 Signed

Governor Rauner signed HB 40. Since HB 40 went into effect, 41% of patients at PPIL have used Medicaid to pay for abortion care.*
