This year, our 75th anniversary, we celebrate their incredible courage and honor the thousands of people in our region who we serve today.

Our health center is now open six days a week, providing affordable preventive care and helping people plan their lives and their families. Our educators now teach thousands of young people, parents, and professionals about sexuality and sexual health. Today our advocates are raising our patients' voices and protecting your rights.

I'm grateful for every person who helped us get here. My heartfelt appreciation goes to all of our donors and volunteers. Planned Parenthood's staff has extraordinary courage and commitment to our mission and deserves the highest recognition.

In a culture rife with taboos, patriarchy, and widespread discomfort with sexuality, Planned Parenthood Greater Memphis Region has been standing strong as an institution of non-judgmental care, honesty, and empowerment for 75 years. The battles we have fought together enable millions to have control over their bodies and have transformed our community, country, and the world.

We are at a pivotal juncture. Now is our time to care, serve, educate, and advocate for the people who need us. The threats against reproductive rights and access to affordable, non-judgmental health care have never been greater.

While so much changes, our mission remains as clear and vital as the day we first opened our doors. We will provide care, education, and advocacy—no matter what—now and always.

You'll also read about the success of our education programs, where we reach hundreds of teens, parents, and youth-serving professionals with fact-based information on sex, sexuality, and reproductive health care. You'll read about our advocacy work – the essential efforts of our volunteers to ensure legislative and community support for our services. Finally, we hope you'll be pleased to see you are in good company as we recognize the more than 400 people and organizations who contributed toward our annual operations.

I hope you'll pay special attention to the section devoted to our Now Campaign. As part of PPGMR's strategic plan, we are expanding facilities and programs that ensure access and equity in reproductive health care across the Mid-South. Toward that vision, we have raised over \$10.4 million of our \$12 million goal. We publicly announced our plans at our 75th Anniversary James Award Celebration in September, and I hope you and others will help us complete this ambitious campaign.

We can do better than having a syphilis rate 10 times the state and national rates, chlamydia rates double that statewide and national, 300-400 new HIV infections annually, and a teen birth rate higher than both the state and national rate. But we can't do it without you.

The accomplishments highlighted within this annual report are as much yours as they are PPGMR's—without you, none of this would have been possible. There is truly no way to fully express what your support means for us and those we serve.

TWO COLLEGE CAMPUS GENERATION ACTION CHAPTERS

Generation Action chapters are Planned Parenthood college education and advocacy organizations. Members organize events to educate and mobilize the student body on issues affecting sexual health and reproductive rights, connect students to local Planned Parenthood health centers, and serve as a pro Planned Parenthood presence on campus. Five area students attended the National Generation Action Conference, a training for young leaders to build a national network, learn from movement leaders, meet with their elected officials, and define Planned Parenthood's Youth Agenda for the coming year.



6 COMMUNITY ACTION TEAMS WITH 121 TOTAL MEMBERS

Community Action Teams (CATs) organize events and recruit volunteers in the community to raise awareness about sexual and reproductive health and rights. CATs are a broad group of concerned individuals in our community who work with and support Planned Parenthood health centers, and mobilize advocates of reproductive rights.

20 LET'S GET R.E.A.L. TEEN ACTIVISTS

2016 was PPGMR's second Let's Get REAL (Raising Empowered Activist Leaders) summer camp. This is a free, week-long opportunity for young people to learn more about effective activism, with sessions on topics such as reproductive justice, sex education, organizing groups and campaigns, and self-empowerment through storytelling.

24 TRAINED FULL SPECTRUM ABORTION DOULAS

In partnership with CHOICES Full Spectrum Doula Collective, PPGMR began training abortion doulas to engage with patients before, during, and after their abortion procedures to provide emotional care and comfort. Volunteers provide "head of the bed" support during abortion procedures. They also provide support in the recovery area and assist with clinical tasks as needed.

HEALTH CENTER ADVOCACY PROGRAM

PPGMR's Health Center Advocacy Program (HCAP) aims to establish and strengthen a support base that accurately represents the diverse groups of people who utilize Planned Parenthood's health care services. HCAP seeks to engage health center visitors in meaningful advocacy and volunteer work, ultimately giving patients the opportunity to become advocates for their own reproductive health. By educating and mobilizing individuals in the communities we serve, our HCAP Team members play a crucial role in helping Planned Parenthood reach the communities in greatest need of our services.

**In 2016, Planned Parenthood Greater Memphis Region and Planned Parenthood Middle & East Tennessee dissolved their respective 501(c)4 political advocacy organizations and form a single statewide 501(c)4, Tennessee Advocates for Planned Parenthood (TAPP), to better defend reproductive health and rights in Tennessee.*

FREE CONDOMS MEMPHIS is a public health and information program of Planned Parenthood Greater Memphis Region designed to reduce the spread of HIV by encouraging the correct and consistent use of condoms.

The program provides free male and female condoms and other safer sex materials, such as dental dams and lube, at partner sites around Memphis and Shelby County and encourages condom use through a public information campaign using traditional and social media. PPGMR and the Free Condoms Memphis distribution program have distributed over 1.6 million condoms since 2013- more than three condoms for every resident of Memphis! 2015 was our most successful year, seeing 745,323 condoms distributed at 82 sites.

As of September 2016, FCM has distributed 481,357 condoms at 85 sites and is on target to surpass our 2016 goal of 500,000 condoms and other safer sex materials.

Our Free Condoms Memphis distribution sites include the kinds of convenient places target populations visit every day. They range from barber shops, nail salons, tattoo parlors, bars, nightclubs, and auto repair shops, to churches, government and social service agencies and health clinics. PPGMR partners with other HIV prevention and care organizations such as Hope House, Partnership to End AIDS Status, Le Bonheur Community Health and Wellbeing, Friends For Life, and Adult Special Care; government and community agencies including Shelby County Crime Victims Center, OUTMemphis, SisterReach, The Vet Center, Memphis Health Center, MidSouth Peace and Justice Center HOPE Project, Regional One Health Adult Special Care, and Memphis Kwanzaa International; local businesses including Warren Lewis Original Hairstyles, Dru's Place, Spectrum, House of Ink, GenX, All Star Barbershop, Headliners, Pro-Nail Salon, Visions of Beauty, First Impressions REMIX, and many others; and faith-based organizations including Urban Family Ministries, Holy Trinity, and Caritas Village.

PROGRAMS —

Youth Comprehensive Sexuality Education

Everyone, regardless of age, has a right to honest, accurate information about sex and relationships. PPGMR offers culturally and linguistically-sensitive programs for adolescents and parents, emphasizing social and emotional skills as a key component of healthy relationships and responsible decision making.

When teens have and share accurate sexual health information and knowledge, they help not only themselves, but their friends, their siblings, and our community as a whole. JustUs is a peer education program of Planned Parenthood Greater Memphis Region, dedicated to providing honest, comprehensive information about sexual health. JustUs educates and empowers teens age 15 to 18 to take ownership of their community and serve as knowledgeable leaders for their peers.

Our Educators offer bi-monthly Sexual Health Saturdays that include opportunities for Middle School sexuality education, JustUs curriculum for High Schoolers, and parent sessions.

Sexperts

Sexperts is PPGMR's sexual health peer education program for college students. The Sexperts program creates an environment where young adults can engage in open and honest discussion about sexuality and sexual health. PPGMR educators provide accurate information and facilitate discussion covering such topics as anatomy and physiology, contraception, STIs, HIV/AIDS, and healthy relationships, gender and sexuality, sex in the media, sex in politics, and body image.

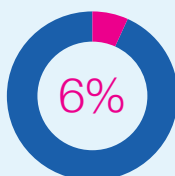
Adult Sexual Health Education

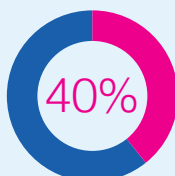

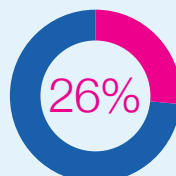
PATIENTS BY AGE



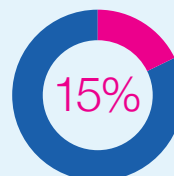
Ages 17 & Under



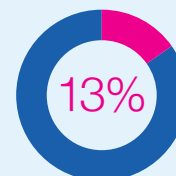
Ages 18-24

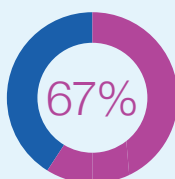

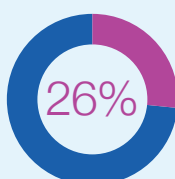

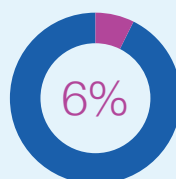

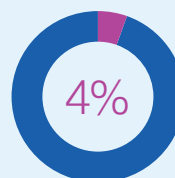
PATIENTS BY LOCATION



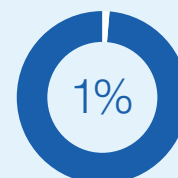

Our rate for teen births and sexually transmitted infections are the highest in the state and often the nation. Young people report being more sexually active and at earlier ages than the state and national rates. This stems from stigma associated with sexual health issues and a hostile political climate regarding reproductive health care. The result is a lack of comprehensive sexual health education and restricted access to health care resources.

PPGMR is ready for the challenge and prepared to attack these issues now. But we need your help. That is why we launched a five-year, \$12 million strategic growth campaign, The Now Campaign, to expand patient services; increase education, outreach and advocacy; and ensure our long-term sustainability and strength through endowment.

The Now Campaign will increase access to affordable reproductive health services in a safe, compassionate environment, and ensure that PPGMR can sustain its operations in the future. The campaign will achieve these goals:

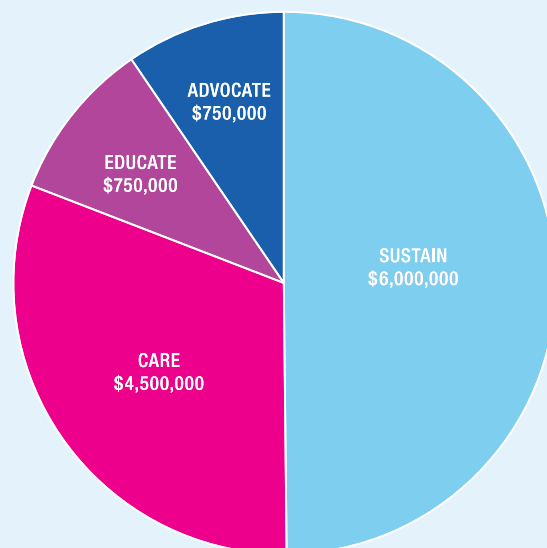
